





- Focuses on a limited portion of the Property


Natural Resource Management Plan Protect, Conserve and Enhance Natural Resources

- Establishes a grazing plan

### Mitigated Negative Declaration

CEQA Compliance

- Analyzes potential impacts from:
  - NRM Plan on a programmatic level
  - IA Plan on a project level
- Mitigates impacts to a less-thansignificant level



### **Interim Access Plan**

#### **Limited Focus**

Focuses on the west side of Coyote Canyon (core of the property)



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#### **Balancing Nature**

Designed based on findings from NRM Plan

**Recommended Alignment** 

Provides loop trail connections for users and north/south patrol route for maintenance and operations

### **Balancing Public Access and Natural Resources**


Recommended Public Access Alignment

- Segment of the Bay Area Ridge Trail
- Views of the City of Morgan Hill & Santa Cruz Mountains
- Accessible from the existing trail system in Coyote Lake – Harvey Bear Ranch County Park
- Most of the recommended option uses the existing ranch road network




### NRM Plan Goals

- Monitor and protect occurrences of sensitive plants and communities
- Improve riparian habitat and water quality through selective cattle exclusion areas
- Monitor and protect oak woodlands
- Monitor and protect nesting birds, golden eagles, and wintering burrowing owls
- Monitor and manage invasive plants and wild pigs
- Enhance habitat and species as staffing and funding allows



## **Grazing Plan Goals**

- Protecting, conserving, and enhancing natural plant communities
- Minimizing fire hazards to parklands and private property by managing vegetative fuels
- Rehabilitating degraded vegetation and wildlife habitat
- Establishing cooperative relationships with adjacent property owners
- Provide safe, recreational access for park users



### **Environmental Review**

The Department has reviewed the Project under CEQA to fully assess any potential environmental impacts and moved forward with a Mitigated Negative Declaration. Comments were related to wildfire, hydrology, biological resources, trail construction and grazing on the Property.
