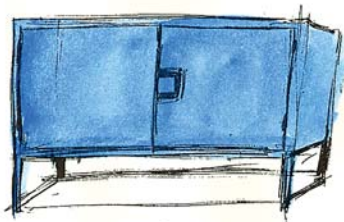

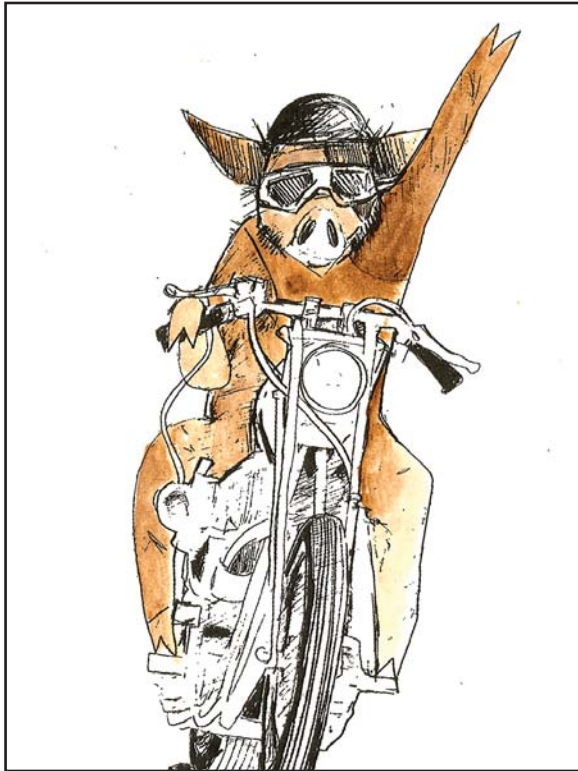


Pig facts that aren't boar-ing 2

Feral pigs went HOG wild!



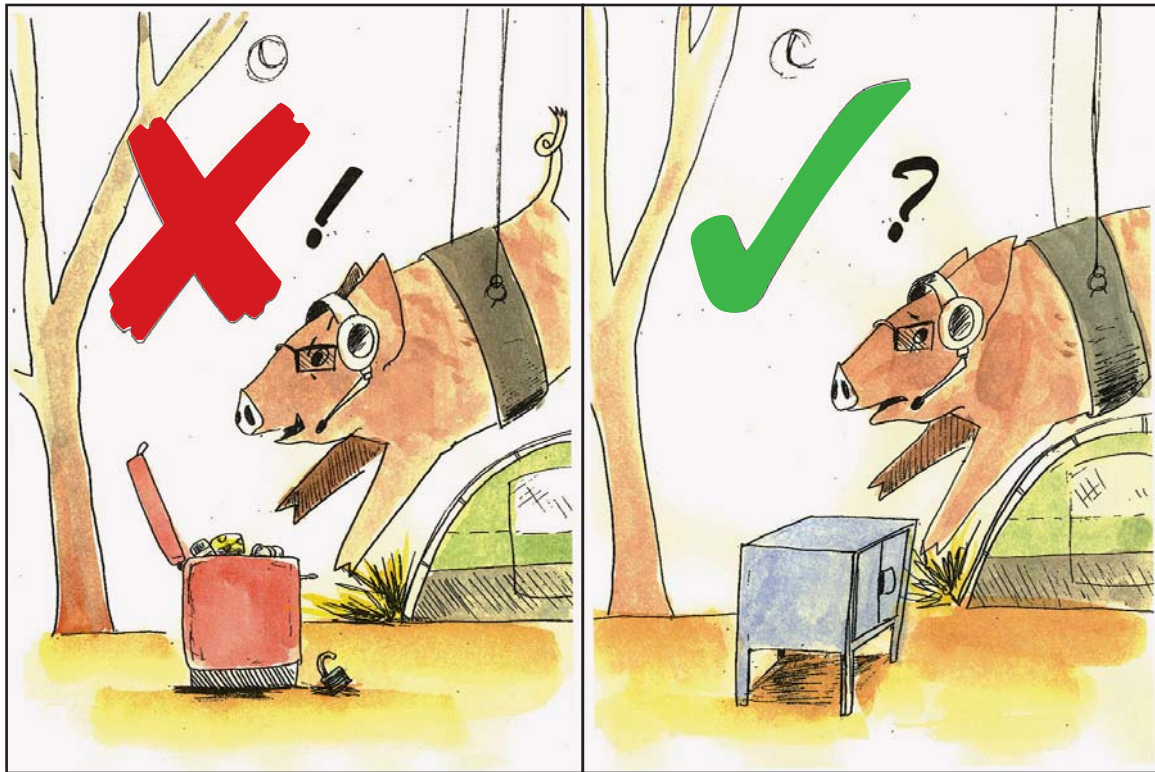
Pig facts that aren't boar-ing 3

- Feral pigs cause 3 billion in property damage every year in the U.S.

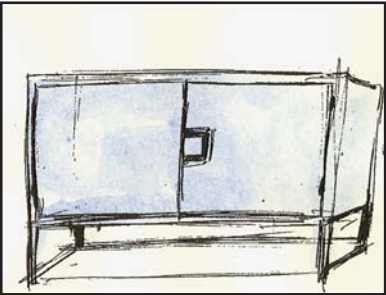

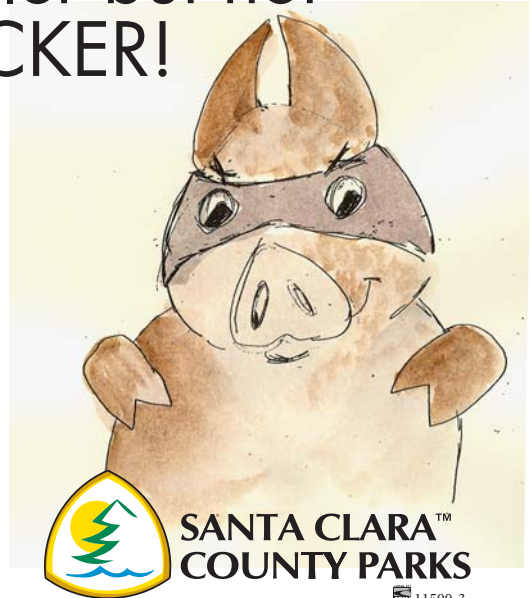

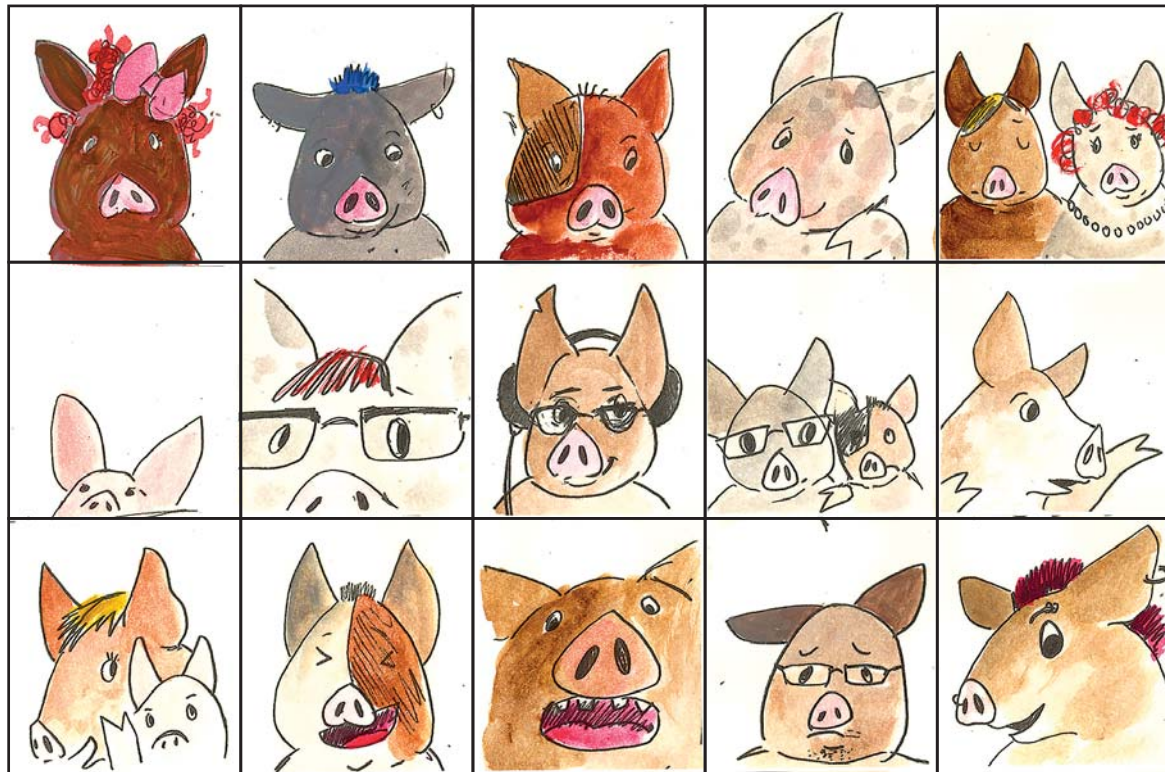
Pig facts that aren't boar-ing 4
